About where we live

The Parish of Slaley

Set on a ridge six miles south of the Tyne valley, the village of Slaley provides an excellent starting point for visitors to this part of Northumberland. The area remains farming country, with woods, streams and fields, and a network of footpaths and bridleways.

At the eastern end of the village, Townfoot is the site of the village's Commemoration Hall, given to the village in commemoration of the safe return from WW1 of the Hunting family's sons.

To the north lies Juliet's Wood, one of Northumberland Wildlife Trust's newest reserves, while further south are the grounds of Slaley Hall hotel, with two golf courses and a network of footpaths open to all. The southern boundary of the parish looks over to the Derwent Reservoir.

To the West, Townhead at the junction with the B6306 road from Hexham, is the venue for the annual Slaley Show in August. The Show began its long history in 1848 and carried on through two world wars to the present day.

From the Hexham road you look west over woods and fields towards the valley of the Devil's Water, while to the south lies the extensive Slaley Forest.

Within the forest is the Ladycross stone quarry, one of the last hand-worked quarries in Britain, producing stone and slates for restoration work in churches and cathedrals from Durham to Canterbury. The surrounding nature reserve is open to visitors by arrangement. Rough roads thread the forest, and a sculpture trail can be followed, while the southern edge of the forest leads on to the open Blanchland Moor.

The History

There have been references to a settlement at Slaley since the time of the Norman Conquest. Slaley then became part of the Barony of Bolbec. In later centuries Scots invaders and the Border Reivers harried Slaley and towns nearby.

Local industries have included lead smelting, when packhorse trains carried the lead along the Lead Road. Quarrying, and farming were and still are important occupations.



Local community representatives

Slaley Parish Council

Your Parish Council is the local authority that makes some decisions on behalf of the people in the parish. It is the level of government closest to the community with Northumberland County Council above it in the hierarchy. The Parish Council is often the first place people will go with concerns or ideas and for this reason is a vital part of the community.

Slaley Parish council usually meets 11 times a year, on the 3rd Monday of each month in the Commemoration Hall, the meetings begin at 19:00. The Annual Parish meeting is normally held in September. Dates of meetings are published in Slaley News, on the Parish Council website and on the Parish Council notice boards situated in the Church Yard and at Park Side bungalows.

Members of the public and villagers are encouraged to attend and speak to the council during open forum at the beginning of each meeting.

Community Activities and events

There are a number of activities and events that happen across the week and month in Slaley. Many are centred around our lovely village Hall which was refurbished and extended in 2022. With good parking and green space all around it, the Commemoration Hall (also a War Memorial Hall) is within easy walking distance of the pub, shop and St Mary's Church. <https://www.slaley.org.uk/commemoration-hall/>

The hall has a very well-appointed kitchen with an industrial quality range cooker and dishwasher with a full range of cutlery, crockery and cook-ware with access, through a hatch to the main hall. There's access to five new, spacious gender-neutral toilets, one of which has disabled facilities and a baby-changing facility. Our new Community Room opened in 2022 providing a more intimate setting with double doors leading out onto a large deck with fabulous view of The Cheviot.

The Main Hall, as a flexible space with loop system and wifi, has accommodated wedding meals and christenings, (and wakes), sports and fitness, afternoon teas and suppers, badminton and film club, conferences and meetings. With chairs and tables, table tennis tables and AV cabinet all on the same level, these are accessible to all.

We have to admit to having a gas boiler for the coldest of days but we have newly fitted solar panels and solar battery storage to help keep all users warm. Our flexible heating system means that our halls can be used independently.

About the Slaley Show (2nd Saturday in August)

This annual exhibition of produce, livestock and skilled craftsmanship by the local community of Slaley and surrounding districts has seen many changes in its history to become one of the best village shows in Northumberland. Successive generations have worked hard to maintain the Victorian tradition of an annual 'get-together' of local people competing in friendly rivalry, or simply chatting over a cup of tea and a sandwich.

Beginning life in 1845 as the Slaley and Hexhamshire Floral and Horticultural Society it changed venue from the Stanegarth Garden to its present location at Townhead in 1916. The number and types of classes have changed over time; initially only flowers, vegetables, bread and eggs were shown, with animals being restricted to best dressed chickens! Gradually, classes for sheep, calves, poultry, goats and more recently alpacas were introduced, whilst the Industrial Section, encompassing everything from baking to photography, knitting to stick dressing, goes from strength to strength, attracting over 1000 entries in 2018.

Competitive sports have always proved popular, whether motor cycles or terrier racing, children's games or the spills and thrills of the horse and pony classes, which now attracts competitors from far afield.

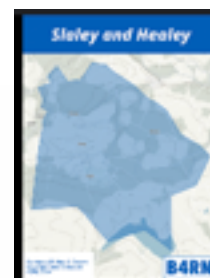

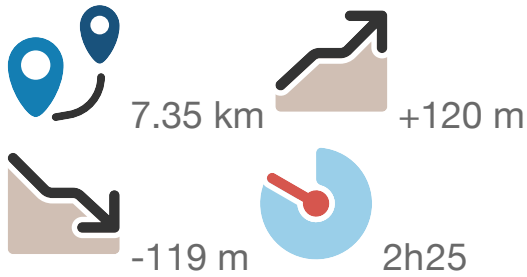

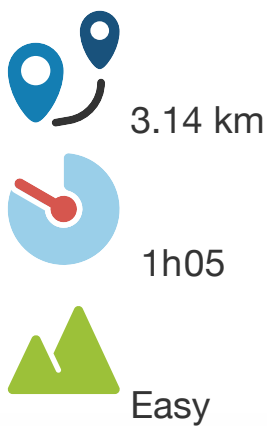

The station is staffed on a part-time basis with two platforms, each with two self-service ticket machines accepting card or [contactless payment](#) only, seating, waiting room, next train audio and visual displays and an emergency help point. Step-free access is available to both platforms, with platforms also linked by a barrow crossing (with assistance only) and footbridge.
